Power of Community Partnerships

The Academy of Finance (AOF) thrives with the consistent and generous support of the community. Numerous guest speakers help students develop the essential public speaking skills and learn how to dress for success. Local businesses conduct class visits for worksite tours of their specialized facilities, and students participate in informational interviews with distinguished participants. Students also engage in mock interviews with trained Human Resource professionals and business mentors partner with the AOF to help students launch startup companies, and prepare for competitive presentations. Partnership with the dedicated school and district NAF Advisory Boards and Greater Naples Chamber of Commerce, assist students in securing paid internships.

PROMISING PRACTICE:

Integrated Project-Based Learning

Miami Edison Senior High School, Academy of Finance and Entrepreneurship emphasizes integrated project-based learning from 9th through 12th grade cohorts to offer opportunities for deeper learning in-context and for the development of important skills tied to college and career readiness. Students explore real-world issues, such as developing innovative concepts for sustainability, including improving methods to recycle and repurpose disposed plastic products. Projects are inter-disciplinary focused, include work-based learning elements, and are showcased at various culminating events, such as the annual Financial Literacy Fair.

A Financially Fit Culture

Celebrating its 30th anniversary this year, the NAF Academy of Finance at Miami Jackson Senior High School has been preparing students to be "financially fit" for decades. The administration has built and maintained a strong partnership with the Florida International Bankers Association (FIBA) since their inception—offering jobs shadows, guest speakers, internships and financial support. Once again, this summer, high school students will participate in the coveted summer internship provided by institutions, such as The City of Miami, Future Bankers' Camp, hosted by Miami Dade College's (MDC) School of Business, the Center for Financial Training at MDC, and other independent companies. These real-world experiences shape young people to enter the world of work.

The Academy of Finance partners with leading industry and education representatives to guarantee that the curriculum and activities are both current and relevant. The academy is supported by a very active Advisory Board, ensuring students are taking part in real-world experiences—including field trips, job shadow days, guest speakers in the classroom, paid internships, as well as having the opportunity to earn college credit.

Academy Collaboration With Other Disciplines

Students from the Allied Health Pathway, Firefighter Academy, and Sports Medicine magnet all make up the NAF Health Sciences Academy at Everglades High School. Specific teachers are chosen to work with students and develop teams that integrate sports medicine into the curricula. For example, psychology can be tied to a discussion on traumatic brain injuries and concussions, as part of the health and wellness program. Additionally, the academy collaborates with the English department to review research papers, as part of the exercise science curriculum. When teachers work as a team and find common ground among their own disciplines, students reap the benefits and can confidently make real-world connections.
