

2019 **LEADERSHIP FELLOWS**

The 2019 cohort of Leadership Fellows, selected from among the nation's most recognized professionals in their fields, will be provided opportunities to further hone their expertise in enhancing college and career opportunities for high school students in their local communities. The 12-month program includes opportunities to engage with leaders from across the country. In between sessions, participants complete rigorous coursework, including robust preparatory activities tied to upcoming session topics and an independent project.



Michael D. Armbruster, Ed.D. Associate Superintendent, Career and Technical Education, Florida

Dr. Armbruster is in his 33rd year with Orange County Public Schools (OCPS), serving as a teacher, coach, assistant principal, and principal before assuming his current role. As a principal, he served at three high schools over thirteen years, with populations varying from 2700-4400 students. During his current tenure as Associate Superintendent, NAF academies have grown from 11 to 34 with at least one academy in each of the district's 20 traditional high schools.



Erin Ward Bibo, Ph.D. Deputy Chief of College & Career Programs, District of Columbia Public Schools, DC

Dr. Bibo oversees Career Education, College Preparedness Programming, Postsecondary Planning, and JRTOC for the District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS). Prior to joining DCPS, Dr. Bibo served as Director of Policy and Planning for Postsecondary and Career Education for the Office of the State Superintendent of Education, the District's State Education Agency. She also previously worked as Assistant Director of Degree Programs at the Harvard Kennedy School. Bibo earned her Ph.D. in Education Policy from the University of Maryland, College Park, and her Master's in Education Policy from Harvard University's Graduate School of Education.



Alyssa R. English, Career Development Lead, Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools Charlotte, North Carolina

Alyssa English has been with Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools for 22 years. She spent 19 years as a Marketing teacher; 2 years as the NAF Academy of Engineering Director; and 1 full year in her current role. Ms. English serves on the Advisory Board of the State Employees Credit Union - Matthews Branch, earned the Facilitating Career Development credential in 2016 and is a National Board Certified Teacher twice over.
