In 2021-2022, NAF proudly announced that more than 200 academies reached Model quality level and 181 reached Katherine Blasik Distinguished quality level. Of these, 157 academies have reached this level more than once and 24 are new to the roster.

This commitment to quality and successful outcomes serve as a reminder that we can supply the highest level of quality experiences to benefit our students. While we must not forget the obstacles that the pandemic posed for our network, we applaud our Katherine Blasik Distinguished and NAF Model academies for always putting students first – congratulations on this tremendous accomplishment!



Students in Springbrook's Academy of Information Technology are taught that they have a genuine capability to excel in technology. We build tomorrow's leaders, by offering a wide variety of courses in programming and engaging extracurricular activities. For example, our AOIT Makerspace joined forces with our Science Department to create projects that won first and second place at the state Math, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) competition. Every year, our students also plan and facilitate a two-day coding event, called Brook Codes, that has yielded a dual-enrollment agreement with a local university. Over 90% of our students have an internship with agencies such as the NSA, FDA, and the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab.

The instructors teaching our academy students are current and former health care workers, who bring real-life experiences into the classroom. Young people organize blood drives, help teach CPR classes to other students and community members, and practice patient care skills in their classes. For example, our nursing assistant students participate in clinicals at Jackson South Medical Center and shadow doctors and nurses working with patients, and our emergency medical responder students participate in real-life simulations to apply the life-saving skills that they would use in emergencies.

Our academy focuses on preparing every student to be college and career ready, by ensuring that they learn financial literacy skills while in high school and encouraging them to make sound

financial decisions. Young people engage in enriched cross-curricular learning activities that allow them opportunities to collaborate and gain knowledge about financial products, services, and more. This year, students were tasked with a community service initiative — helping under-resourced individuals in our community — and created care packages with essential items. Ultimately, this project enabled them to use their critical thinking and decision-making skills, while building character, confidence, and fostering a sense of belonging.

Students can earn several industry certifications, including: Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), OSHA 10 for Health, Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers, Bloodborne Pathogens Training, and Functional Movement Screening, and our graduates can go straight to work as an entry-level CNA. We've had internships and experiences offered at the Veterans Hospital and multiple care facilities that our young people have participated in during their academic careers. Students can also earn college credit that can be applied to



programs locally (Fresno City and Fresno State), as well as courses that will transfer to the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC) systems.



FRIENDSHIP COLLEGIATE ACADEMY, ACADEMY OF HEALTH SCIENCES WASHINGTON, DC

We offer a variety of work-based learning opportunities to prepare our scholars for college and careers in the health sciences field. Our students learn skills that are commonly used in the industry while still in high school. They are exposed to many different careers and college majors and are mentored by industry professionals to help make informed choices about their next steps. Additionally, young people have the opportunity to research and visit top colleges that offer majors in the health sciences field to help support their decision-making.

GLADSTONE HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF HEALTH SCIENCES COVINA. CA



Graduates leave our program with skills gained from real-world experiences and highquality work-based learning — demonstrated through internships with our partners at City of Hope, Kaiser, Emanate Health, Keck, and Charter Hospice. These experiences in the medical field provide early exposure for students and offer them a guided path for the future, so that they can decide what careers they would like to pursue. Additionally, students receive pre-certification in a variety of areas of medicine, ensuring they are highly marketable

upon graduation. Our academy delivers the necessary knowledge for students to become certified by the state of California, as medical assistants, and allows them to work at the clinical level with physicians, PA's, and nurse practitioners.

HARTFORD PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF ENGINEERING & GREEN TECHNOLOGY HARTFORD, CT



Our collaboration with Raytheon Technologies, ReadyCT, and the Gawlicki Family Foundation have helped us to develop a well-rounded work-based learning continuum and to provide paid internships for over 100 students. Our partnerships with Goodwin University and the CT Department of Transportation allow us to provide dualenrollment opportunities and industry certifications. Students have weekly college and career readiness workshops to prepare them for internships, with consulting from our work-based learning coordinator, and participation in future readiness programming all year long. Guest speakers, worksite tours, networking events, student ambassador programs, a robotics club (and much more), make this pathway rich in terms of opportunities and experiences for our students. We are grateful for our partnership with Raytheon Technologies, as they have been a key partner to this work.

GOLDEN GATE HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF ENGINEERING NAPLES, FL



Our Academy of Engineering strives to make as many opportunities available to our students as possible, through a variety of handson, collaborative, and activity project-based approaches to learning. They develop skills

in technical documentation, as they learn 3D computer modeling using CAD applications, build code, produce precise 3D printed prototypes, and test autonomous robots. Every year, students also participate in a solar go-kart race and VEX Robotics competition. The solar go-kart project tasks young people with converting gas golf carts to solar powered, as they learn the importance of renewable energy. Completed go-karts are used in competitions with other schools from Southwest Florida.

GOLDEN GATE HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF FINANCE

Our students have access to higher-learning opportunities for hands-on educational experiences in the areas of check writing, cash counting, and various accounting software — such as QuickBooks. They also learn about calculating payroll, completing tax returns, marketing, stock market simulation trading, and entrepreneurship. These lessons are inclusive

and frequently accompanied with work-based learning activities, including mentorship, guest speakers, field trips, and competitions.

The Academy of Education offers a rigorous hands-on learning program to students interested in becoming future educators. Student teachers receive certification through the Department of Children and Families and the Council for Professional Recognition, where they are awarded their National Child Development Associate. Education students take part in work-based learning experiences — in our on-site preschool program and in nearby feeder-pattern elementary and middle schools. Students write and carry out developmentally appropriate lesson plans with the children and plan events and activities throughout the school year.



LELY HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF HEALTH SCIENCES NAPLES, FL

Throughout the school year, students are exposed to a plethora of work-based learning activities and career exploration labs — helping to unpack the vastness of the medical field and all the different careers available. Through hands-on activities, young people have gained a better understanding of a medical professional's day-to-day responsibilities. They also have participated in career fairs, mock interviews, job shadows, and career readiness conferences. As a result, the academy has recent graduates actively working in local hospitals.



One prime example of this is the creation of a food pantry, that was planned for and developed, and is run directly by our young people.

We strive to prepare students for college and beyond, by training students to use industry tools to provide them with an advanced technological skillset. We also offer various student clubs to promote leadership, team building, and career development skills. For example, Girls Leading Our World is a girl-to-girl mentoring program designed to amplify the voices of females, and our VEX Robotics team members

collaborate and use engineering principles to design, build, program, and compete against other teams.

We have partnered with Florida International University and Miami Dade College, touring their engineering campuses to gather information on their programs. Other offerings with initiatives such as Engineering Tomorrow, the Teach-a-Thon program, and the Phillip and Patricia Frost Museum of Science, allowed students to take part in engineering labs, virtual lessons, and worksite tours.


NEW BRITAIN HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF HEALTH & SCIENCES NEW BRITAIN, CT

NEW BEDFORD HIGH SCHOOL, ACADEMY OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY NEW BEDFORD, MA


